Technical Requirements:

- The internet abstract submission system works best with the latest version of either Google Chrome, Internet Explorer, or Mozilla Firefox, please avoid using Safari.

For Your Abstract Submission:

- Please carefully read all instructions in the abstract submission system before preparing your abstract.
- For standardization, the acceptable length of the abstract is not more than 3,000 characters and 45 lines. This also includes characters, such as spaces, and punctuation. The abstract title is also included.
- The abstract should be structured into the following sections:
 - ✓ A title which clearly indicates the nature of the investigation
 - Names of authors and institution(s) – presenting author to be marked with an asterisk (*)
 - ✓ Objectives
 - ✓ Methods
 - ✓ Results
 - ✓ Conclusions
 - ✓ References (non-mandatory)
 - Conflicts of interest

- Please indicate preference: oral presentation/poster/either. Indicating a preference for oral presentation does not guarantee an oral presentation.
- One table can be included with the following criteria: max. 5 rows x 4 columns
- Abstracts can be saved in “Draft” status to be re-edited and modified until the submission deadline (31 May 2024). Therefore, the submitter will be required to create a user account.
- Abstracts fulfilling all criteria can be saved in “Final submission” status. Only abstracts in “Final submission” status will be regarded as successfully submitted and considered for the congress. Abstracts in “Final submission” status can be re-edited and modified until the submission deadline (31 May 2024).
- An abstract can only be submitted if the “Rules and Regulations” on the online abstract form are accepted.
- **Conflict of interest:** It is the intent of the Congress to provide high-quality sessions focused on educational content that is free from commercial influence or bias. Thus, the submitting author of an abstract is requested to declare any potential conflicts of interest for all authors during the abstract’s submission.
- Only abstracts that contain **original data (including qualitative studies, systematic reviews and meta-analyses)** can be submitted.
- Abstracts submitted to other conference(s) may be submitted but will not be eligible for the prizes. Full papers that have been published (print or online) are not eligible for submission. Please declare if presented elsewhere.

After The Submission:

- All abstracts will be reviewed and scored by a renowned group of experts and scored.
- Please ensure that your abstract does not contain spelling, grammatical or scientific errors, as it will be published exactly as submitted. No proofreading will be done. Please use either US or British spelling all through the abstract.
- Abstracts not adhering to these guidelines will be rejected. If you do not agree with any of these rules, you should not submit an abstract. The final decision about acceptance of an abstract will be taken by the Scientific Committee.
- The submission of an abstract constitutes a formal commitment by the presenting author to present the abstract (if accepted) orally or as a poster in the session and the time assigned by the Scientific Committee. We therefore recommend that submitters of abstracts register for the congress simultaneously with abstract submission.
- Accepted abstracts will be published online only in **Clinical Nutrition ESPEN**. These will be citable and have a doi number.
- Only those abstracts actually presented at the Congress will be published.
